#### **BISHOP'S CORNER**



Four Great Significant Occasions in the Life of a Buddhist
Bishop Eric Matsumoto

As we observe Nirvana Day in February and Buddha Day (or Hanamatsuri) approaches reflecting on the life of Sakyamuni Buddha, we find 4 momentous occasions in his life. First, there is his birth as Prince Siddhartha Gautama on April 8<sup>th</sup>. Secondly, there is the attaining of Enlightenment by the former Prince Siddhartha Gautama on December 8<sup>th</sup>. Third, there is the Parinirvana of the Historic Buddha on February 15<sup>th</sup>. Traditionally, these occasions are highlighted by what is known as the 3

Great Services which commemorate very significant occasions in the life of the Historic Buddha.

However, I would like to suggest that there is a fourth very significant occasion which is Sakyamuni Buddha's sharing of the Dharma (which traditionally does not have a date in Mahayana Buddhism). For simplicity's sake, I would like to select January 25<sup>th</sup> as that date based on the information that the enlightened Sakyamuni Buddha is said to have stood up from meditation 49 days after attaining enlightenment. After 49 days of further reflection, the Historic Buddha moved by Great Compassion stood up from meditation with the aspiration to share the Dharma with others.

Examining the life of Shinran Shonin, I see a pattern too. He was born as Matsuwakamaro Hino. Though it is not enlightenment, he takes refuge in the Pure Land Teachings. Then, at the age of 90, he attains birth in Amida Buddha's Pure Land and thus attains Enlightenment or Nirvana. Although selecting a precise date might be hard the date traditionally used for the establishment of Jodo Shinshu could be interpreted as Shinran Shonin's sharing of the Great Wisdom and Compassion of Amida Buddha with others.

As you may have surmised, I am emphasizing the sharing of the Dharma and/or one's Joy of the Dharma as an important part of the life of all Buddhists. For Jodo Shin Buddhists by virtue of Shinjin or the Mind of True Entrusting that we received from Amida Buddha, the wish or aspiration to attain Buddhahood and also wishing for others to also attain enlightenment arises within us.

My conclusion is that these 4 occurrences are common to life of all Buddhists. We are all born. We all encounter the Dharma or Teachings. We all wish to share the Dharma and/or the happiness, joy or tranquility which we are experiencing with others wishing to enter into a life of enlightenment together. Then, finally, we all attain the Great Nirvana which in Jodo Shinshu expressed as birth in the Pure Land of Enlightenment at the end of this finite life. For all Buddhists, I would think the thought is that these Teachings are too precious and valuable to keep for only oneself. It should be shared with others so others can experience great peace,

happiness and tranquility too. In the case of Shinran Shonin too, his joyous experience of gratefully finding himself embraced and never forsaken by Amida Buddha is something so precious and rare that he wants to share it with others. For we, Jodo Shin Buddhists, we don't become enlightened like Sakyamuni Buddha in this life, but rather at the very end of this life we enter into enlightenment with our birth into the Pure Land and all of it is made possible not by my own effort, but by the Great Unconditional Compassion of Amida Buddha based on the 18<sup>th</sup> Vow.

The sharing of the Nembutsu Teachings is a natural process or outcome of encountering Great Wisdom and Compassion or attaining Shinjin or Mind of True Entrusting. It is not contrived, but a natural sharing of the Joy and Peace of the Buddha-Dharma. To me, a Jodo Shin Buddhist inspired by the Great Compassion of Amida Buddha and out of gratitude humbly reaches out to others as did Shinran Shonin, fully knowing or realizing how incapable I am of exhibiting anything close to Sakyamuni Buddha's achievements and accomplishments, but there is a sincere aspiration which aspires/hopes/wishes that others too can experience these wonderful Nembutsu Teachings. Again, I would express or explain that Shinran Shonin was "Responding in Gratitude" to Amida Buddha's immense compassion. He wanted to share his awareness, his joy, his gratitude of Namo Amida Butsu with others and we should too!

As a closing reflection, I would like to share a quote of Shinran Shonin. "I praise Amida's wisdom and virtue, So that beings with mature conditions throughout the ten quarters (of the Universe) may hear. Let those who have already realized shinjin, Constantly respond in gratitude to the Buddha's benevolence."

Namo Amida Butsu, Entrusting in All-Inclusive Wisdom and All-Embracing Compassion.

## GISEIKAI MESSAGE FROM THE JODO SHINSHU HONGWANJI-HA GOVERNOR GENERAL BISHOP CHIKO IWAGAMI

On the occasion of the 108th *Giseikai* of the Honpa Hongwanji Mission of Hawaii, I humbly extend my appreciation to you, the ministers and sangha representatives from throughout the state of Hawaii, for gathering here. I would also like to express my heartfelt gratitude to you all for your continuing efforts in propagating Jodo Shinshu and maintaining the temples within your respective districts.

Upon completion of Monshu Ohtani Kojun's trip to the BCA temples last year, the first round of his official visit to the overseas districts was duly finished. Having Canada as the first destination, his trip began 5 years ago, prior to the conducting of the accession ceremonies. Thank you for welcoming the entourage at every stop. This successful accomplishment would have never been possible without your cooperation, and for that, we are truly grateful.

Another significant incident of the last year is the establishment of the Jodo Shinshu International Office in San Francisco, which is expected to enhance the efforts in sharing the Buddha Dharma on the global scale. Its opening ceremony was conducted last September with the attendance of Gomonshu, as well as the bishops and presidents of the four overseas districts. In his address delivered during the ceremony, Monshu Ohtani expressed his keen anticipation for the office to become the foundation to share the Jodo Shinshu teaching with people across the world. In order to allow the office to expand as the propagational base beyond the framework of each overseas district, your guidance and cooperation is crucial.

At Hongwanji, the 850th Anniversary of Shinran Shonin's Birth and the 800th Anniversary of Establishment of the Jodo Shinshu Teaching will be conducted in 2023. Having this Joint Celebration before us, the special organizational structure that consists of several divisions was launched on November 1st last year. Since then, every conventional department of the Hongwanji institute has been allocated to one of those divisions. This celebratory service should be observed

with our gratitude to the founder Shinran Shonin and our joy of encountering the Jodo Shinshu teaching because we would not be who we are today without either of them.

In today's world where a self-centered way of thinking prevails, ranging widely from small communities to the national level, we, the sangha of Nembutsu followers must endeavor to realize a society in which everyone can live a life of spiritual fulfillment, and as an activity in that effort, we must move forward aiming at the successful observance of the Joint Celebration.

In closing, it is my hope that the Honpa Hongwanji Mission of Hawaii will continue to prosper and that many fruitful results will arise from this annual meeting.

In an effort to reduce our fundraising expenses, we humbly request donations of sushi nori, Mitsukan vinegar, sugar, canned tuna, kanpyo, red and green shrimp flakes, rice, etc. We ask that donations be made no later than **April 3, 2020** to determine the remaining amount of ingredients that will need to be purchased.

Most importantly, please set aside some time from your schedule to assist in the preparation for the chicken and sushi sale. We will need all the help that we can get and your participation will be greatly appreciated by all involved. The work schedule is as follows:

March 14 (7:30am): Cut & split firewood. (Please bring a chain saw if available).

March 28 (7:30am): Prepare fire pit for cooking. Clean & repair grill racks as needed.

**April 6-10 (7:30 am):** Prepare the equipment, utensils and supplies (clean the food holding units, fill the propane tanks, cut tie wires, cut aluminum foil, wash necessary sushi utensils and equipment, etc. Wash utensils & containers for rice cooking. Prepare sushi vinegar mixture. Sharpen knives.

April 9 (7:30am): Install & test motor & chain for chicken broiling. Connect & test lights in chicken cooking area. Prepare sushi ingredients. Prepare tables & floor in the hall.

**April 10 (7:30 am):** Split and salt chickens and store in barrels.

**April 10 (1:30 pm):** Light fire in cooking pit and begin loading chickens onto racks and broil chickens

April 11 (4:00 am): Start washing rice & cooking rice for sushi

(5:15 am): Begin sushi making

(10:00 - 12am): Chicken and sushi pick up period (11:00 am): Clean up equipment, utensils and facility

(12:00 pm): Break for lunch and continue with clean up if necessary
