BISHOP'S CORNER

"Amida Buddha's Pure Land and A hui hou" Bishop Eric Matsumoto

In the midst of the O-Bon Season especially if you are observing your First O-Bon after parting with someone dear to you, I am sure you are thinking of/remembering "loved ones gone to the Other Shore (Pure Land)" to use the words of Cecilia Lindo. If tears well up in your eyes, for most of us, that is perfectly natural. You need not feel bad. However, I hope that you are not experiencing only sadness, grief and loneliness for there is also joy, hope

and assurance.



In Hawaii, many times after we get together, we use the phrase *A hui hou* which means "Until we meet again" to say goodbye to each other. The appreciation being that, though we are saying bye to each other, it gives a sense of continued connection in that we will see each other again and thus this is only a temporary parting.

In a similar way, commonly, a phrase of the Smaller Sukhavativyuha Sutra (*Amida Kyo*) known as *Kue issho* or "will be able to meet together in one place" provides much solace, hope and continued connection

between those who have lost someone and those who have passed away in that both will be able to meet in the Pure Land.

Strictly speaking, the line in the sutra says "because they will be able to meet together with such sages of supreme virtue there." It is in response to the question, "...people who hear of that land should aspire to be born there. Why?" There is a deeper profound reason as to why we should entrust and aspire to born in Amida Buddha's Pure Land.

Amida Buddha's 1st Vow promises that the Pure Land and its residents are free of suffering, self-centered greed and domination by power with the 3rd Vow promising equality of one and all. The 11th Vow of the Buddha promises that all who are born in the Pure Land "dwell in the stage of the truly settled and necessarily attain nirvana" which means that all who, at the end of their life, are born in the Pure Land by the virtue of True Entrusting (Shinjin) of Amida Buddha's 18th Vow will instantly become a great "sage." Amida Buddha's Great Wisdom and Compassion, is promising that we are all, with no exceptions, being promised not only peace and happiness, but also unlimited life and the great perfection. In other words, we will each be the best "I" that "I" can be. In this regard, "I" am still "I," but at the

same time not exactly the same "I" as "I" have been ultimately transformed into the most perfect and wondrous "I" that "I" can be, enlightened. Thus, though it can be sad and we may experience sadness and being lonely after a loved one's death, when we become aware of Amida Buddha's Great Wisdom and Compassion and what it is promising each of us, we should also feel assured that we are still connected and that a great joy and positive change awaits all of us including that we will be able to meet each other again.

"A hui hou," is not only a greeting. This is my interpretation and understanding, but the Indigenous culture of Hawaii believes that once you meet someone you are forever connected and the probability of meeting again is high. Likewise, in Pure Land Buddhism, "Kue Issho" are not only words engraved on gravestones, but true reality where all come together again. The Pure Land is truly a compassionate realm of oneness and inclusiveness with connectivity to one and all.

Please know that the activity of Amida Buddha's Compassionate Name (Namo Amida Butsu) and Light will not cease until one and all are not only nurtured and embraced, but we become it. This is the Pure Land. Shinran Shonin describes the Pure Land as "The Land of Immeasurable Light" and "The Land of All-Knowing Wisdom."

During this O-Bon Season, as you remember your dear loved one(s) at a O-Bon Service or Bon Dance to which anyone and everyone is invited to attend, please take this opportunity being presented to you through your loved one(s) to become aware of the Great Aspiration of Amida Buddha and the world of A hui hou where we will all certainly meet again.

To conclude, let me share the entire verse/stanza of the Bon Dance Song "Joy and Peace" * mentioned above.

The beat of the taiko goes boom, boom, boom And sends a message of good cheer To loved ones gone to the Other Shore Who've passed their love of Amida to us.
