HHMH Statement on Environmental Harmony

Joint Statement by Bishop Eric Matsumoto and Steve Lohse, Chair of the Green Hongwanji Committee, Honpa Hongwanji Mission of Hawaii


"We are here to awaken from the illusion of our separateness." - Thich Nhat Hanh



We experience rapid, extreme environmental change as crises, and when our environment is in crisis, we suffer. We depend on the environment for everything, including stable climate, public health, clean air and water, energy, fertile soil, healthy food, land and sea resources, and the biodiversity that underlies sustainability. Environmental crises give rise to social, economic, political, and spiritual crises that in turn further degrade the environment. We are inescapably interdependent with the environments that we abuse as well as with the environments that we protect.

The causes of environmental crises are not external threats, we do this to ourselves. As our sheer numbers, consumer expectations, and developing technologies combine to overwhelm natural systems, we are witnessing an era of transition from life defined by natural processes to environments defined by human activity. Sadly, it is increasingly clear that greed, anger, ignorance, and ego-driven human activities are out of harmony with sustainable natural systems. Meanwhile, global responses to environmental degradation remain inadequate and directed largely at symptoms rather than causes.

As Buddhists, we see a way forward. We see that environmental harmony arises from Interdependence and from addressing root causes of environmental crises - our own greed, anger, and ignorance. We see that inner transformation, from ego-driven thinking to Dharmaguided entrusting, prepares us to understand and commit to wise, compassionate, effective action for environmental harmony. Just as Buddha touched the Earth as bearing witness to Enlightenment, so we touch the Earth to bear witness to Dharma guidance that inspires us to engage in skillful environmental action as an Earth Touching Sangha.



David Loy said, "Engagement in the world is how our personal awakening blossoms." As we go to the Dharma for guidance to live in harmony and sustainability with our precious planet, we commit to the following:

- understanding the inherently interdependent, holistic nature of Buddhism;
- transforming environmental actions by first transforming environmental thinking;
- teaching clean, healthy, sustainable environments as a basic human right;
- acting effectively, always informed by Cause/Effect and scientific best practices;
- supporting sustainable societies based on social/economic/environmental equity, universal human rights, respect for nature and for future generations, and a culture of peace.

Shinran Shonin, the founder of the Jodo Shinshu school of Buddhism, sought enlightenment while practicing as a Tendai monk on Mt. Hiei. In this seminar, he will provide possible interpretations as to how certain events in Shinran's life helped to shape his religious thought. In addition, we will look at some of his writing to see what are the key points in his teaching, which will bring forth to light just how significant his contribution was to the development of Buddhism as a whole.

Rev. Dr. Takashi Miyaji is currently a minister at Southern Alameda County Buddhist Church since August 1, 2020. In addition, he teaches at the Institute of Buddhist Studies located in Berkeley, California. His previous assignment as a minister was at Tacoma Buddhist Temple from December 2017 to July 31, 2020.

He graduated from the University of California at Berkeley with a Bachelor's Degree in Philosophy and Japanese language and literature, Institute of Buddhist Studies at Berkeley, California with a Master's Degree in Buddhist Studies, Ryukoku University in Kyoto, Japan with a Master's Degree in Shin Buddhist Studies, and completed the doctoral coursework at Ryukoku University. He specializes in the areas of Japanese Buddhism and religion, translation of Buddhist scripture, and Jodo Shinshu doctrine and ethics.

Rev. Miyaji received his Tokudo and Kyoshi qualifications at the Honpa Hongwanji school located in Kyoto, Japan. He also obtained the academic ranking of *Hokyō* recognized within Hongwanji. He most recently completed his doctoral dissertation entitled, "Shin Buddhist Ethics," through Ryukoku University.

Kapaa Hongwanji Mission's 100th Anniversary Service will be coming up real soon. Please be sure to save Sunday, October 23 at 11:00 a.m. for this memorable celebration. The first temple was established on October 1922. Our ancestors' dream was to have a gathering place to share the Buddha's Teachings and provide memorial and funeral services. Their hope was to continue to provide this opportunity for future generations to enjoy. We look forward to continue this mission and welcome the younger generations to join us in promoting peace, harmony and gratitude.

The Commemorative Service will be officiated by Bishop Eric Matsumoto with our past resident ministers, Rev. Shinkai Murakami, Rev. Kazunori Takahashi, Rev. Shawn Yagi and the Kauai ministers, Rev. Tomo Hojo and Rev. Mieko Majima. Unfortunately, Rev. Kawaji will not be able to attend and extends his regret. It will be nice to once again meet and greet the ministers.

In August we needed to fumigate the temple and parsonage due to increased termite activity. The treatment cost \$12,000 which was not included in the 2022 Budget. We will once again need to replenish our Building Fund for several repair and maintenance concerns for the temple and parsonage. The buildings tend to deteriorate a lot faster as we are located near the ocean and the salt air causes a lot of damage. We had hoped to complete the commemorative project before the centennial celebration however, we will need to revisit and decide in 2023.

We will be meeting with two consultants from Oahu who are coming at their own expense to assist us with some fundraising suggestions. They have assisted us since the Covid years began and continue to do so. Thankfully, with their support and headquarters providing a position for Rev. Majima, we have been able to keep the temple open. If you are available on Thursday, October 6 at 1:30 p.m., please take this opportunity to meet two kind, caring and compassionate individuals who have taken the time from their busy schedules to extend a helping hand. The future of our temple depends on our Sangha.
